# **TENNIS CHALLENGE & GALA RECAP**

In 2018 Award USA hosted HRH The Prince Edward, Earl of Wessex at over 40 events in 12 days across 9 cities. The focus of the Tennis Challenge visit was to raise awareness of the Award with stops to engage with national leadership of youth development agencies, share in visits seeing the Award in Action and support the Inaugural Award USA Gala. The Award was also promoted through HRH The Earl of Wessex's Gold Award activity and current sport—Court Tennis. 
