The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award can be used as a framework to support the Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) requirement of the International Baccalaureate (IB). Both programs value and promote outside the classroom learning.

The Award prepares students in the Middle Years Programme to engage in CAS, and provides Diploma Programme students with an additional internationally-recognized credential for the activities they are required to complete for their IB diploma. Students in the Career-related Programme also benefit from the Award's alignment with the CP Core.

ONLINE RECORD BOOK



Award Participants use the Online Record Book website and app to set personalized goals, track their weekly activity reflections, and have them confirmed by an activity Assessor. This aligns with the CAS section of platforms like ManageBac.
